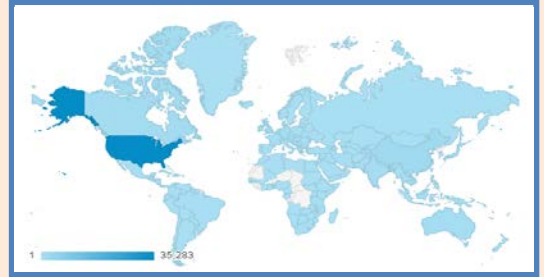

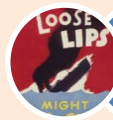
Student Scholarship
