Description

The Myers-Liebegott Papers is a small collection, but it contains some powerful photographs and documents. The information about the Gettysburg College trip to Harlem, contained in Series 3 is particularly interesting for capturing images and information of Harlem during the late 1960s and as documentation of the social activism of the Office of the Chaplain. Copies of *Forty Acres and a Mule*, published by students on the Educational Program of the New York Urban League are presumably connected to this trip.

Another interesting item in this collection is a 1948 letter written by a German woman, appealing to Charles E. Liebegott for financial or other assistance.

Provenance

Items in this collection were donated by The Reverend Victor A. Myers, grandson of Charles E. Liebegott, Class of 1912); Addendum items were transferred from the Unity Lutheran Seminary Archives and Adams County Historical Society by request of the donor.

Biographical Note

Victor A. Myers spent the 1967-1968 academic year as a Chapel intern with Rev. John Vannorsdall in Gettysburg College's Christ Chapel while a student at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg . Myers also had another connection to Gettysburg College: his grandfather, Rev. Charles Edgar Liebegott was a member of the Pennsylvania College Class of 1912.

As a chapel intern at Gettysburg, Rev. Victor Myers had the opportunity to take a five-day trip to New York City with a group of 12 Gettysburg College students that was co-sponsored by the Chaplain's office and the Women's League. The group visited the headquarters of the Lutheran Church of America and met with various church officials. They did a walking tour of Harlem with local pastors, toured the United Nations, saw the off-Broadway production of *The Fantasticks*, spent time in a Greenwich Village nightclub and met jazz musicians including Ray Charles and Roland Kirk. One group of students visited the Harlem Preparatory Academy and another group spent time at the Harlem College Assistance Program [HARCAP]. The trip was designed to give students exposure to Lutheran Church activities in the city and encourage social awareness and activism among the Gettysburg students.

Charles E. Liebegott was born in 1888 in Altoona, PA. At Pennsylvania College, he was a member of both Class and Varsity football teams, the Athletic Council, Student Council, Pen and Sword, Class Debating Teams, Scrubs, Phi Delta Theta Fraternity, Sophomore Band, and the YMCA. He was Class President, Editor-in-Chief of the *Mercury*, and Associate Editor of the 1912 *Spectrum*. Liebegott graduated from the Gettysburg Lutheran Theological Seminary in 1915 and married Clara Elaine Popoken in September of that year. He served as an Army chaplain during the First World War. After serving as pastor at Hebron Lutheran Church in Avonmore, PA (1915-1917), Pittsburgh, PA (1917-1920), and the Seventh Street Lutheran Church in Lebanon, PA (1920-1930). In 1930, Rev. Liebegott moved his family to Akron, OH, where he served as pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran church until his death in 1939.

Scope and Content Notes
