The collection of postwar artifacts relates more broadly to war memory and commemoration, and includes items such as paper souvenir fans from the 75th anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg and postwar lithographic prints. This collection provides excellent examples of Civil War related material culture, though the items are not specifically linked to one soldier or individual. The collection as a whole reflects the personal interests and efforts of Rev. Dr. Schlack as a collector over the course of many years.



Rev. Dr. Theodore Schlack graduated from Gettysburg College in 1950 with a degree in English. He went on to attend the Lutheran Theological Seminary and became a minister, serving as pastor of Christ Lutheran Church in Allentown. He became an avid collector of Civil War artifacts
