MS-290: WWII Diary of Leslie Wright Jr., U.S. Signal Corps

Description

Leslie Wright Jr. enlisted in the United States Signal Corps on September 15, 1941, serving as a 2nd Lieutenant, until he was honorably discharged on January 9, 1946. He was first stationed in Richmond-Upon-Thames in Southwest London, before being transferred to Grimsby, in North East Lincolnshire.

This diary details a wide array of subjects relevant to Wright's personal life and his service with the United States Signal Corps. References are made to politics and pop culture in the early 1940s.

Biographical Note

Leslie Griswold Wright Jr. was born on October 11, 1914, in Malden, Massachusetts, the son of Leslie Gordon Wright Sr. (1887-1961) and Clara Cook Wright (1889-1979). His World War II Draft Card lists him as being six feet tall, 145 pounds, with a dark brown complexion, brown hair, and hazel eyes. At the time, he was employed by the Massachusetts School of Optometry. Wright enlisted in the United States Signal Corps on September 15, 1941, serving as a 2nd Lieutenant, until he was honorably discharged on January 9, 1946. He was first stationed in Richmond-Upon-Thames in Southwest London, before being transferred to Grimsby, in North East Lincolnshire.

In 1945, Wright married Marjorie Hamilton (1915-1998). The couple continued to live in Massachusetts, where Wright died at age sixty-four, on September 9, 1979.

Historical Note

This book covers the second and third years of World War II, and only the first and second years of the United States' involvement.

This diary details a wide array of subjects relevant to Wright's personal life and his service with the United States Signal Corps. References are made to politics and pop culture in the early 1940s.
