MS-293: Gillilan Family Letters

Description

This collection contains approximately 90 letters written by various letters of the Gillilan family, including Lewis, his parents, wife, and children. The bulk of the letters are written by Lewis between 1909 and 1910, but there are also a significant amount written by his daughter, Lois, in 1939. These letters provide insight into the life of a stagecoach driver and a young woman studying medicine in Europe during the rise of the Nazi party, amongst other things. Many of the early letters also depict Lewis and Ellen navigating their personal relationship as it was contested by their families.

All of the letters in this collection have been transcribed and the transcriptions are housed within the S Drive Student Folders. A few of the letters are available on GettDigital in the Virtual Reading Room.

Biographical Note

Lewis Gillilan (1891-1942) worked as a stagecoach driver during the early 1900's. Later in his life, he worked as a farmer and within a telephone and telegram company. He married Ellen Benson in 1910 despite both of their parent's objections to their relationship. They went onto have five children: Robert, Lois, Marjorie, Elizabeth and Parnel. Lois Gillilan went on to study medicine in Michigan, Amsterdam, and Aberdeen during the late 1930's.

Historical Note

By the late 1890's, automobiles were becoming increasingly accessible in the Unites States, so it is notable that Lewis Gillilan still worked as a stagecoach driver a decade later.

World War II officially began on September 1, 1939 when Adolf Hitler invaded Poland. As Lois Gillilan travelled to Amsterdam in August of 1939 to study medicine, she witnessed the anxious atmosphere present in Europe in the lead up to the Nazi occupations occurring across Europe. She travels from Amsterdam to Aberdeen, Scotland before the invasion of Poland, during which journey she encounters many people fleeing the soon to be occupied territories.

Scope and Content Note

This collection contains approximately 90 letters written by various letters of the Gillilan family, including Lewis, his parents, wife, and children. The bulk of the letters are written by Lewis between 1909 and 1910, but there are also a significant amount written by his daughter, Lois, in 1939. These letters provide insight into the life of a stagecoach driver and a young woman studying medicine in Europe during the rise of the Nazi party, amongst other things. Many of the early letters also depict Lewis and Ellen navigating their personal relationship as it was contested by their families.

All of the letters in this collection have been transcribed and the transcriptions are housed within the S Drive Student Folders. A few of the letters are available on GettDigital in the Virtual Reading Room.
